- \$2 Resident/\$10 NR-Base Hunting License
- Pittman-Robertson Federal Funds
- Limited permit drawing refunds (new in 2022)
- Outfitter preference point (portions)
- Small Grants/Donations
- Home to Hunt License
- General License
- General Fund (tax credit- unlocking public lands)




- -1,300 cooperators

- Opens 620,000 acres of inaccessible public land

















Block Management Total Payments by Year










