Dear Commission Staff:

I listened in to the December 15 hearing on the proposal to repeal ARMs 12.11.6702 and 12.11.6706, dealing with rest/rotation and walk/wade regulations on the upper Madison River. I am writing to say that I support the proposed repeal, and further, I support the adoption of rules that would restore the regulatory "status quo" that I understand has prevailed on the upper Madison for at least several decades.

I write as an angling tourist to Montana, who has traveled there to fish the upper Madison River and other rivers in each of the last three summers. I live in Massachusetts and enjoy fly-fishing in fresh and salt water throughout the New England region, with occasional trips to other fishing destinations in the U.S. and Canada. I am member of the Board of Directors of Greater Boston Trout Unlimited (our local TU chapter), although these comments represent my own personal views.

My trips to Southwest Montana over three years have totaled 27 days, with 23 angling days in a combination of guided float, guided wading and non-guided wading trips. I note that all of these days have been in the month of August.

From this limited view, I have to say that I have not found overcrowding or angler conflicts to be an issue at all. The upper Madison in late summer has given me and my travel companions a great, world-class fishing experience. While long time users might find it intolerable, I found the number of fellow anglers to be reasonable, even on weekends on popular stretches. I found the riverbanks and FAS areas to be pristine and free of trash. Compared to most other places I fish, Montana is paradise.

I respectfully believe our biggest problems are not our fellow anglers, even given the explosive growth of Southwest Montana. While a fix is beyond the power of the Commission, the hotter, dryer climate and what that will do to fishing, hunting and all other recreation in the coming years is a far bigger challenge.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment, and I look forward to many more years of fishing the Madison.

Commissioners:

Please maintain the wade/walk status of the Raynolds-to-Lyons section of the upper Madison River. I ask that you repeal Administrative Rule 12.11.6702.

I am sure that you must be under pressure from economic forces to open nearly the entire river to guided boat fishing. You can do the right thing and stand up for the health of the trout that drive this economic engine. Trout need areas with fewer fisher people. The fishery has degraded since my childhood in the 1950s and 1960s. We may not be able to return the Madison to its flows, temperature, lack of invasive muscles, etc. but we can take some human pressure off fish to give them hiding places and space.

With the recent debacle with the dam gate and subsequent lack of flow, it is more urgent than ever to protect fish as a resource. And also because it is the right thing to do. Years ago, David Quammen wrote about trout and synecdoche making the point that if trout thrive, the river system is healthy, desirable, balanced. Attractive to humans. Healthy trout define the whole of the Madison Valley. Healthy trout arise from good decisions. The Madison Valley has more people, more homes, drier winters than in the past and therefore it is more incumbent than ever on us to protect the river and the animals that depend on it.

I fish less now than I used to but my advocacy for the beloved Madison River has not waned. We are not greater than the trout; we are dependent on the trout for the Madison Valley to feel whole. I hope the economic forces understand that we must all be river/trout stewards for fishing jobs to continue into the future. Less pressure on fish now makes for a healthier future trout population and thereby allows people to continue to benefit from their relationship with trout. Please focus on the long term in your decision making.

Comment on the repeal of ARM 12.11.6702 Submitted by Hugh Zackheim, Helena, MT December 17, 2021

I support repeal of ARM 12.11.6702, which would open the upper Madison River between Raynolds Pass Bridge and Lyons Bridge to fishing from a boat on weekends from June 15 through September 30, beginning in 2022.

My purpose in supporting repeal of this rule is to keep the existing prohibition on fishing from a boat on the entirety of the section of the upper Madison River from the Quake Lake outlet downstream to Lyons Bridge. This prohibition has been in place since at least 1987, and continues to serve an important and popular purpose of providing a place exclusively reserved for wade fishing.

Additionally, I understand that the simple repeal of ARM 12.11.6702 may not be sufficient to accomplish this goal, so I would urge the Department and the Commission to work together to craft and adopt appropriate language that does achieve the goal of keeping the walk/wade section intact by continuing the existing prohibition on fishing from boats in this section of river.

Here are some further details regarding why I believe ARM 12.11.6702 should be repealed and the walk/wade status quo should be continued.

During this past summer myself and a small group of other volunteers handed out questionnaires to over 300 individuals fishing the upper Madison walk/wade section between Raynolds Pass Bridge and Lyons Bridge. We wanted to know anglers' thoughts on the new rule that would allow fishing from boats in the river section. This section has been closed to float fishing since the 1980s, and through these last four decades has developed a deserved reputation as one of the top wild trout wade-fishing experiences in the country.

Our questionnaire asked, "Should anglers be allowed to fish from a boat on the Madison River from Raynolds Pass Bridge to Lyons Bridge?" The results? 99% of the respondents — 301 out of 305 — answered NO.

Many of these anglers have fished this section of the Madison for decades, and they enthusiastically support the walk/wade status quo. They're very concerned about conflicts between waders and boaters if fishing from boats is allowed here beginning in 2022.

Here's a statement submitted by one of our survey respondents, a southwest Montana resident, that I find to be particularly on point:

"Three Dollar Bridge and the surrounding waters have been special to me as an angler for over 25 years. This is a place where any angler of any background, socioeconomic factor or ability can have access to world class fishing opportunities and camaraderie. People of shared interest come together, discussions break out in the parking areas and friendships are made. I'm a boat owner but believe some places must remain sacred. I know that boat traffic interrupts the solitude of wading and negates the effort of those who choose to hike in."

Finally I want to express my thanks to the members Madison River Work Group and the Fish & Wildlife Commission for their timely action in addressing this important recreation issue — before it becomes a problem —by seeking repeal of ARM rule 12.11.6702 and by adopting any other necessary language to maintain the no-fishing-from-boats regulation year-round throughout the Quake to Lyons walk/wade section.

To Whom It May Concern:

I am one of the many anglers who completed a questionnaire last summer (2021) concerning whether float fishing should be allowed from the Raynolds Pass/Three Dollar Bridge area of the Madison River down to Lyons Bridge. I was happy to have been asked, and delighted to respond. My unequivocal response was No! Never! Not in anyone's lifetime! Outside of greed and hubris, there is no need to open that section to float fishing.

I have fished this area of the Madison for 32 years in a row, so I do not consider myself an uninformed outsider or occasional sport and in fact I have written a fair amount about the delights of that stretch of river in my book, *Angling Days: A Fly Fisher's Journals* (NY: Skyhorse Publishing, 2019). I am 100% committed to keeping that great stretch of unique, beautiful, bounteous wild trout water free from float fishing, which if it had been allowed by a recent (and thank God reversed) MFW Commission act, would have exponentially increased pressure on that part of the river and would have probably hastened an unfortunate element of decline that could only compromise and damage what is surely one of the most unique stretches of angling water not just in Montana, but in the entire USA.

I have already in recent years had a number of encounters with driftboaters floating down that stretch of river. Some do more than drift and look at the scenery; some are actively fishing from boats, which is in fact illegal and unethical. A couple of years ago a guide and his two clients fished right down the Idaho side of the Madison below Three Dollar Bridge and nearly ran me over. I was crouched down in the water a few feet from the bank watching a feeding trout downstream. The oarsman wasn't watching. I jumped out of the water when I heard his oarlocks creak behind me, and just in time. Other anglers have told me something similar has happened several times and with increasing frequency in the past two years in the walk/wade section. I think I speak for many of us, then, when I say it is paramount to protect that stretch from further incursions. Given effects of climate change, rising water and air temperatures, minimal snow pack, decline of insect populations, etc., the fish have enough formidable hurdles, so why add one more by giving access to a juggernaut style of angling? The glorious place is special and should be protected for what it is without hesitation. It is why people like me come to Cameron, MT from all over the world, year after year.

It should be clear by now that I favor—wholeheartedly—repealing Administrative Rule 12.11.6702 that would allow opening of the Raynolds Pass/Three Dollar Bridge to Lyons Bridge section of the Madison. And to that I will testify further should the need arise.

I am writing to support the repeal of the administrative rule allowing fishing from boats in the walk/wade section of the Madison River above Lyons Bridge. This repeal has been recommended by the work group evaluating this situation. I am against allowing fishing from boats for the following reasons:

- 1) Fish protection The fish in this section of the river currently have some sanctuary in sections of the river inaccessible to wading fishermen. By allowing fishing from boats in this critical section, this protection will be removed. The fish in the upper river are currently under stress, with a particular decline in brown trout populations. These fish need more protection, not less. And, as of this writing, the current Hebgen Dam malfunction will also cause even more harm to our fish, and they do not need increased pressure from fishing from boats.
- 2) Angler conflict No section of the river comes close to the number of wade fishermen in this section. If fishing from boats were allowed, the crush of boats coupled with wading fishermen will be a conflict disaster.
- 3) Sanctity for the wade fishermen For years this section of river has been a haven for those who want to get away from float fishermen. The experience of wade fishing the Madison will never be the same once fishing from boats is allowed here.
- 4) Boater safety I don't need to tell you how rocky this section of the river is. Imagine the number of fishermen standing up in boats when their boat inevitably collides with these rocks and pitches the unsuspecting anglers into the water. This section is not safe for standing up in boats and fishing while moving.

I have had many boat captains that barely allow me 10-20 feet of water to fish on either side of myself by casting into my immediate fishing zone.

Even though the walk/Wade section is also crowded, it is still possible to wade enough to find some solitude. The current walk Wade section is an oasis of like-minded fishermen, who mostly demonstrate good etiquette, conservation, and consideration to others. They are respectful of traditional behaviors on the River. Please maintain the walk/Wade section on the upper Madison River from quake lake to Lyons bridge and do not allow float fishing to destroy this limited access for Wade fishing only.

It will be a sad day for people and wildlife alike, when float fishing is allowed in the walk/Wade section of the upper Madison River. I favor repealing the rule 12.11.6702 which allows float fishing from quake lake outlet to Lyons bridge on the Madison River.

Thank you for your efforts of continuing to maintain an excellent fishing experience for everyone.
