Background: Game Damage-Management Season-Wildlife Health-Urban Wildlife harvest quotas are adopted biennially for deer, elk, and antelope; wildlife health quotas and special CWD hunt quotas are adopted for deer, elk, and moose. These quotas represent authority and limits to prescribed harvest from any future game damage hunts and/or management seasons and hunts to address wildlife health issues such as brucellosis, tuberculosis, respiratory illness, and CWD. These quotas represent the upper limits to potential prescribed harvest—not necessarily issued permit-license numbers or hunter numbers. The department is proposing no change from the 2020–2021 quotas for most quotas, but the department is specifically identifying new urban wildlife quotas and quotas for bison (game damage) and bighorn sheep (wildlife health). The commission is considering all quotas for adoption from 2020-2021 season, whether a change is proposed or not. This recommendation represents no change from that proposed and adopted by the commission at their meeting in December.
