 - 2) For enrollments of 3,001 acres and over, minimum of 1 Recreation-Day/week for every 1,500 acres. Public recreation access must be in the form of hunting during the Fish and Wildlife Commission approved seasons, between September 1-January 1.
 - *3)* For applying this formula, round to the nearest 300 acres for enrollments of up to 3,000 acres or to the nearest 1,500 for enrollments of 3,001 acres and over.
